Introducing the RPS Snack Bowl

Here's a relatively new initiative the School Council has been working on over the last year that we want to share with our parent and caregiver community. We began this initiative as a way to help address food insecurity within our school but we have learned that this program is so much more than that. By always having access to healthy snacks, we can ensure no student in our school ever has difficulty getting through their day because they are hungry, whatever the reasons behind it. Students have said having access to the snack bowl makes the school feel more welcoming, and more like their home. Here's some facts about our healthy snack station!

- SC volunteer Jen Blackburn oversees this program
- The bowl is refilled daily
- Jen shops for the bowl 1-2 times each week to keep it stocked
- Jen fills the snack station with 500* snacks a month (cereal, apples, bananas and oranges)
- About \$20-\$50 a week was spent in November to keep the bowl stocked and tummies full!


